## This Week's Events (Week 4) National Science Week

This week is National Science Week. National Science Week is an annual celebration of science and technology. It aims to spark students' curiosity in the world we live in and encourage an interest in science pursuits. The schools theme is *Game Changers and Change Makers.* Inspiration for the theme was taken from three significant celebrations in Australia – the 200<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the publication of Mary Shelley's Frankenstein; the 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the birth of the first IVF baby; and International Year of the Reef.



#### **Teaching and Learning Projects**

This semester our school is excited to be involved in two teaching and learning projects.

#### ✤ Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander (ATSI) Histories and Cultures Projects Grant

The ATSI Histories and Cultures Projects Grant centres on the creation of a unit of work titled 'First Peoples – Bangerang/Pangerang'. The purpose of the unit is to broaden student's knowledge, understanding and appreciation for the local Aboriginal culture of the Bangerang/Pangerang People. The unit is being developed by Mrs O'Connor with the support of Owen Dunlop from the Wirraminna Environmental Education Centre and will be implemented next term. Years 3-6 students will participate in a range of learning experiences incorporating English, Geography, History, Science and Creative and Performing Arts. They will also be participating in a text study of a local Dreamtime story.




#### Stage 3-4 English Transition Project Grant

The *Stage 3-4 English Transition Project Grant* focuses on an enhanced transition experience between Stage 3 and Stage 4 with the development of a unit of work that can be taught over the two stages. The unit will be implemented in the final term of 2018 and the first term of 2019, ie. Year 6 into Year 7. Staff will participate in extensive PL on the new Literacy Progressions and English concepts to build deep knowledge, building their capacity to develop rich learning experiences in English and design authentic assessment tasks. Mrs Catherine Browning is working on this project along with teachers from Berrigan PS, Tocumwal PS and Finley HS. On August 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup>, Mrs Browning attended a conference in Sydney along with delegates from the other participating schools and together they drafted an action plan.

#### STEMShare

STEMShare is an initiative that empowers schools with the technology tools to enable students to develop essential future focused STEM skills. In Week 2, the STEMShare team launched the new STEMShare Kit Booking System to all schools in NSW. JPS has booked a Virtual Reality Primary Kit for Term 4. As part of the program, we will have access to learning challenges, how to videos and general support information about STEMShare. This is a wonderful opportunity to extend our students' learning in Science and Technology.
