Principal's Report

Welcome to Week 7. There are four weeks of term remaining and arrangements for our annual end of year events are being completed behind the scenes.

Staffing for 2020 is currently being finalised. Mrs Cameron will be taking up a temporary teaching position at Barooga PS in 2020. An Expression of Interest (EOI) for a K-2 classroom teacher will be advertised this week. Mrs Browning will be returning full time next year and will be teaching 3-6. Mrs Rhonda Bryce will be working one day per week in the role of Learning and Support. I will be supporting Literacy and Numeracy and provide Release from Face to Face (RFF). I will continue to have two office days to complete administration duties.

This is the last year that NSW school students will have Ambulance Cover when on excursion interstate. At the end of the year, all reciprocal arrangements will cease. From Day 1 of 2020, Wednesday 29th January, students will need to have their own ambulance cover or some form of travel insurance to cover the journey cost if an ambulance is required whilst attending an extra-curricular activity interstate, eg. swimming carnivals (Yarrowonga Pool), excursions, etc. In some cases, students would possibly have existing cover as part of their family's private health cover or individual ambulance cover. For those parents/caregivers that have a health care card, their child would be covered under this. Please be advised I will be seeking copies of cover at the commencement of Term 1, 2020.

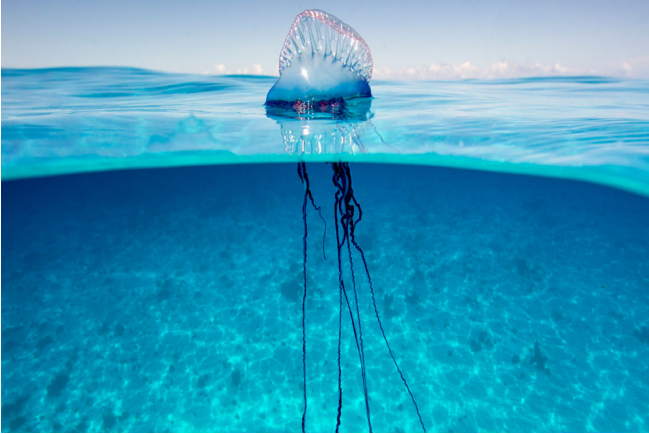

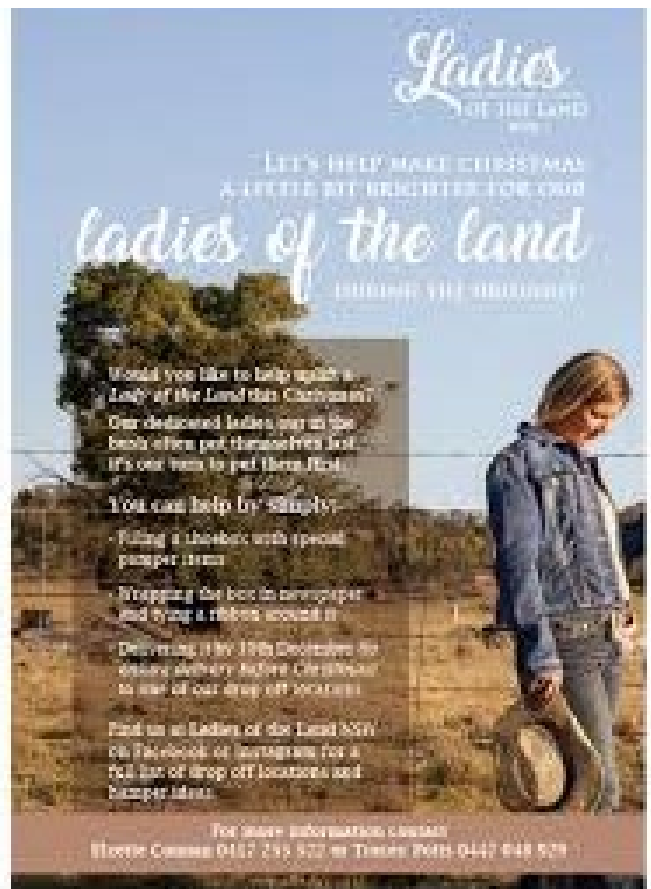
Ladies of the Land Christmas

Pamper Packs

The Ladies of the Land Christmas Pamper Packs is an initiative to support women on rural properties who have been facing severe drought by giving them a surprise 'shoebox' of items for Christmas. As a school community, we would like to invite our students, staff, parents and community members to donate to this initiative.

We would like items to be sent into school and we can make up the 'shoeboxes' to be sent to Orange in Central West NSW where from there they will be flown by air to outback properties in Western NSW, or you may like to make up a shoebox of your own. If you do, the organisers ask that the boxes be wrapped in newspaper and tied with string and do not contain aerosols. These boxes can also be left at school.

All items need to be dropped off at the Office by December 5th. We look forward to sending as many 'shoeboxes' as we can.



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Summer Uniforms

The NSW Department of Education (DoE) supports the wearing of a school uniform which promotes a sense of belonging for students and creates a positive identity for the school community. School uniforms also contribute to the personal safety of students by allowing easier recognition of students inside the school and in the community and to protect students from injury (for example, items for sun protection). JPS expects students to wear the uniform during school hours and also sun-safe hats for outside activities. Students have been asked to keep their hats in their tote trays to ensure they are on hand ready for break times.

Our P&C Association runs a uniform shop via the Office. We ask that parents and caregivers utilise this service so that students are wearing clothing of the same style and colour. To assist families, we also have a clothing pool of preloved uniforms available free of charge. We seek your cooperation in ensuring our students wear their correct uniform to school each day. Nothing makes me prouder than seeing students in their uniform each morning ready to learn.

Healthy Lunch Box

Nutrition Snippet

The simplest way

... to keep food safe in summer.

Foods such as meat, fish, poultry and eggs; cooked pasta, noodles and rice; and dairy items such as milk, yoghurt, custard and cheese need to be kept very cold.

- Use a cooler bag and ice brick or frozen water bottle to keep food cold in the lunch box.
- Freeze items such as sandwich bread, milk poppers, and home-made muffins. They will be thawed and ready to eat at lunch time and keep other lunch box items cold.
- If preparing lunches the night before, store in the fridge or freezer.
- Don't store food in an insulated bag in the fridge, it stops the cold air reaching the food.
- For food that has just been cooked, cool it in the fridge overnight before packing.
