The 2019 calendar was again full of sporting activities. We started the year with our 10 day Intensive Swimming Program. This program is aimed at teaching all our students the fundamental skills of swimming. It has been great to see all of the students engaging in the lessons and being safe whilst at the pool.

Later in the term we travelled to Yarrawonga to compete in the Small Schools Swimming Carnival with several students progressing to the Finley Zone Carnival at Cobram and then onto the Riverina Carnival in Albury. A big congratulations to all those who participated in the events.

Our first JeriBerriO sports team to compete in 2019 was in cricket with our representatives being Logan Eldridge, Katelyn Wilkinson, Chelsea Winn and Dan Eldridge. Dan went on to try out for the Western Riverina PSSA boys' team and Katelyn and Chelsea later in the year trialled for the girls' team.

Dan was selected as part of the Finley Zone PSSA AFL team to attend the Western Riverina trials in Leeton. AFL continued with the JeriBerriO team consisting of Dan and Levi Bell, competing in the Paul Kelly Cup and the Tony Lockett Shield.

Our Small Schools Cross Country Carnival was held in Urana with a large contingent of students returning to Urana to compete in the Zone Carnival, Chelsea advanced to Riverina which was held in Gundgai.

Chelsea was successful in her selection as part of the Finley Zone PSSA Netball team, and travelled to Narrandera to trial for the Western Riverina team. The JeriBerriO netball team including Chelsea, Montana Aylett and Katelyn Wilkinson advanced to the semi-finals of the Riverina PSSA netball knockout competition.

In Terms 1 & 2 we continued our Bluearth lessons with instructor Drew. Bluearth is a program developed to increase movement in children and encourage active living. It focuses less on competition and more on positive participation experiences.

Small Schools Athletics was held in Savernake with the Zone carnival following in Finley and a a small team of students travelled to Albury to compete in the RIverina Carnival.

The Sporting Schools grant provided funding in Terms 3 & 4 for all students to participate in weekly soccer and gymnastics lessons. Soccer in Term 3 was run by Skillzone Sports Coaching and Term 4 gymnastics by Deniliquin Gymnastics Club.

In 2019 we again participated in the NSW Premier's Sporting Challenge which aims to have more students, more active, more often. It isn't just about being fit, it's about building resilience, improving concentration, and supporting overall health and wellbeing.

The Term 4 Spring Round Robin was held in Mulwala for our 3-6 students and included dodgeball, matt ball, ultimate Frisbee and for the first time orienteering for those students willing to learn.

Congratulations to all of the students for their efforts during all of these events and a huge thank you to all of the parents and family members who have helped out throughout the year, providing transport and support for the students. Thank you.

## Housekeeping

#### **Ambulance Cover**

This is the last year that NSW school students will have Ambulance Cover when on excursion interstate. At the end of the year, all reciprocal arrangements will cease. From Day 1 of 2020, Wednesday 29th January, students will need to have their own ambulance cover or some form of travel insurance to cover the journey cost if an ambulance is required whilst attending an extracurricular activity interstate, eg. swimming carnivals (Yarrawonga Pool), excursions, etc. In some cases, students would possibly have existing cover as part of their family's private health cover or individual ambulance cover. For those parents/caregivers that have a health care card, their child would be covered under this. Please be advised I will be seeking copies of cover at the commencement of Term 1, 2020.

#### **School Drive Subsidy**

Parents and caregivers are advised a School Drive Subsidy is available subject to criteria at <a href="https://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/#/schoolDriveSubsidy">https://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/#/schoolDriveSubsidy</a> The subsidy is for driving school students to school or to the nearest transport pick up point. If any circumstances change, or if bus travel is sought, this will form part of a Bus Service Alteration Request (BSAR) from a neighbouring operator.
